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
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### **Announcements**



The Los Angeles Urban League has announced the release of the 2011 State of Black Los Angeles Report.

Co-authored by the Urban League and the United Way of Greater Los Angeles, the report is a comprehensive look at the African American condition and the community in which we live, work, and learn. The 2011 report updates original data from the landmark 2005 report, exposing present conditions and incorporating a Healthy Neighborhood Index<sup>TM</sup>, a tool which allows users to view

conditions through a neighborhood-focused lens.

The goal of this report is to encourage lasting community change by providing a better understanding of challenges and by supporting innovative solutions.

**Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Commemorated** Reprinted with permission from *UCLA Today* 



On April 27, 1965, a crowd of 4,500 **UCLA students, alumni, faculty and staff stood at the foot of Janss Steps to hear Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. speak**. News cameras carried his message to hundreds of thousands more throughout Southern California.

The speech introduced a voter registration initiative known as SCOPE, for Summer Community Organization and Political Educational Project. In spite of the danger, threats and intimidation surrounding such efforts, UCLA students and alumni were inspired to volunteer. To commemorate the event, UCLA has installed a permanent plaque near the base of Janss Steps which was formally unveiled as part of UCLA Alumni Day 2011, Saturday, May 21, 2011.

Now through September 11, 2011 Fowler in Focus: Resilience and Radiance: Arts of Africa and the Americas from the Goldenberg Collection

Resilience and Radiance offers a first chance to view highlights from the major bequest of 180 objects by Barbara and Joseph Goldenberg. The installation will include: striking power figures and initiation masks from the Democratic Republic of the Congo and Angola; fascinating divination objects made by the Baule, Luba, and Yoruba peoples; a stately Fang reliquary guardian; and a stunning Yoruba beaded crown. The collection displays the historical and geographical breadth of the Goldenbergs' artistic interests.

Bunche affiliated faculty member, **Dr. Gail Wyatt**, is a clinical psychologist, sex therapist and professor in the Department of Psychiatry and Biobehavioral Sciences at UCLA. This spring, Dr. Wyatt spoke at several conferences including, "A New Approach to the HIV **Prevention When There is More than Love Between Couples**" Harbor-UCLA Medical Center Grand Rounds, March 1, 2011.

Also in March, Dr. Wyatt was the keynote speaker at the Women of Color & HIV: Annual Community Forum, North Carolina in March 4, 2011, discussing, "Understanding Race Ethnicity Gender HIV."

In April, Dr. Wyatt was a seminar speaker at the Metropolitan Interdenominational Church Technical Assistance Network, where she presented her talk, "We've Come Too Far to Turn Back Now."
