#### Lulu Washington Receives Chancellor's Award

On May 17th, Lula Washington, UCLA class of '76, M.A. '84, and member of the UCLA Black Alumni Association, was honored with the UCLA's Chancellor's Medal - the highest recognition awarded by UCLA to its alumni. Ms. Washington received the award for her community service, working and promoting dance for over 33 years in South Los Angeles. Prior to the awards ceremony, Ms. Washington, who comes from a low income family, talked with students about working her way through UCLA while she majored in dance, and how her Afrocentric approach to the discipline was not always welcomed by the dance department faculty at the time. After graduation, in 1980, Lula and her husband, Erwin Washington, founded the Lula Washington Dance Theater. The company has grown to international acclaim, touring worldwide, but has always maintained home base in the inner city community of South Los Angeles. ### Faculty Members Retire Faculty and Students Celebrate their Tenure



Jacqueline Cogdell DjeDje, Professor and former Chair of the UCLA Department of Ethnomusicology as well as former Director of the UCLA Ethnomusicology Archive, celebrated her retirement this June. Before joining UCLA's faculty in 1979, she taught at Tuskegee University from 1975-79. Her B.A. was obtained from Fisk University where she was a music major specializing in piano. She received the M.A. and Ph.D. degrees from UCLA with a focus on ethnomusicology and specializations in African-American and African music. Hector Myers, Professor of Clinical Psychology, retires this June from UCLA. Dr. Myers' research focused on the role psychosocial stress and related factors (e.g. coping, social supports, personality characteristics, biological processes, etc.) play in physical and psychological health and well-being in African Americans and other ethnic minority populations, focusing primarily on ethnic differences in the role psychosocial factors play in disease.

#### New Stevenson Book Traces Role of Gender in 1992 Los Angeles Riots

In her new book, *The Contested Murder of Latasha Harlins: Justice, Gender and the Origins of the LA Riots* (Oxford University Press, 2013), Brenda Stevenson, professor of history at UCLA and a Bunche Center affiliated faculty member argues that although many of the images of the 1992 Los Angeles riots feature men, a women's story was behind the so-called Rodney King riots, a civil disturbance that she suggests had earlier origins in the earlier Latasha Harlins shooting.
