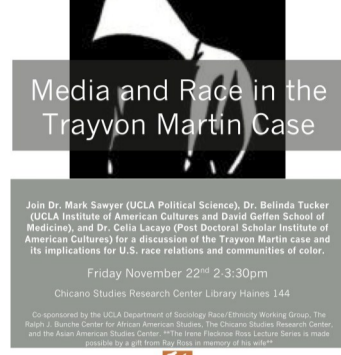

Hunt Highlights Center's Findings on TV Diversity

In October, Bunche Center Director Damell Hunt was featured in a number of news outlet reports highlighting finding in the recently released Bunche Center Race and Hollywood study, "Hollywood Diversity Brief: Spotlight on Cable Television." Media reports highlighted data that demonstrated that ethnically diverse shows had better overall ratings. The study is the first in a series of analyses done for the Center's Race and Hollywood/Hollywood Advancement Project.

First published in 1969, NOMMO is a UCLA student publication written from the perspective of UCLA's African American students.

The publication, which is now exclusively online, gives students the opportunity to share their perspectives with each other and the larger community. Over the years, NOMMO has covered noteworthy political and cultural events on the UCLA campus and in the local community.

The Bunche Center archive houses original print issues dating from 1969-2009, in addition to electronically scanned copies of the paper.
