2014 Summer Humanities Institute Kicks Off in June

In June, the UCLA Bunche Center for African American Studies will host its fourteenth and final Summer Humanities Institute (SHI) from Sunday, June 22 to Saturday, August 16, 2014. The program is funded through generous grants from the Andrew W. Mellon Foundation and University of California, Office of the President. SHI caters to high-achieving students from historically under-represented groups in their junior and senior year, planning to pursue doctoral degrees in the

humanities and social sciences, with a focus on the African American experience. The 2014 cohort hails from eight different schools, primarily historically black colleges and universities. They include: Spelman College; Lincoln University of Pennsylvania; Fort Valley State University; Norfolk State University; Morehouse College; and Savannah State University.
