

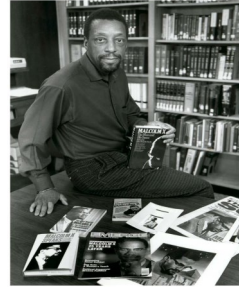

Scot Brown will discuss his forthcoming book, *Discourse on Africana Studies: James Turner and Paradigms of Knowledge* (Diasporic African Press, 2014). Brown is a professor of History and African American Studies at the University of California at Los Angeles and is the author of the pioneering book, *Fighting For Us*, a study of cultural nationalism and the Black Power movement during the 1960s. Brown has appeared in historical documentaries including the prize-winning “41st and Central: The Untold Story of the L.A. Black Panthers” and most recently the TV ONE television series “Unsung,” with its episode on the R & B band known as “Heatwave.” Follow him on Twitter @feelpeace.
