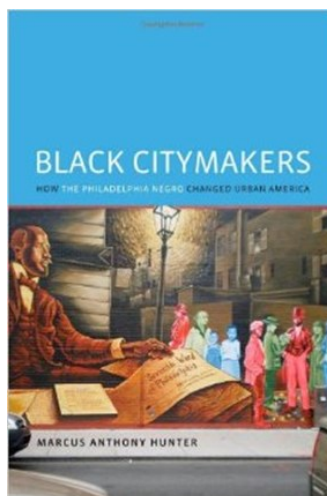

Black Citymakers: How The Philadelphia Negro Changed Urban America (Oxford University Press 2013) revisits the Black Seventh Ward neighborhood immortalized in W.E.B. DuBois's *The Philadelphia Negro*, following its transformation from predominantly black into a largely white upper middle class and commercial neighborhood by the century's conclusion.
