Bunche Center, White House & Community Groups Host African American Student Summit





Crenshaw Releases New Reports

Kimberlé Williams Crenshaw, professor of law at both UCLA Law School and Columbia Law School. She is Director of the Center for Intersectionality and Social Policy Studies (CISPS) at Columbia Law School, as well as a Bunche Center affiliated faculty member. She recently released two reports: *Black Girls Matter: Pushed Out, Overpoliced and Underprotected* and *Say Her Name: Resisting Police Brutality Against Black Women.* In addition, in June, the African American Policy Forum, where Crenshaw serves as executive director, held the 10th Anniversary of their Social Justice Writers Retreat in Negril, Jamaica.

Mullen Gives Keynote at SASS Conference



What Is Slavery? focuses on the experience of enslaved black people in the United States from the colonial period to the Civil War. To learn more about the book, <u>Click Here.</u>






Brown Brings the Funk on Unsung
