BUSINE\$\$ AS USUAL?

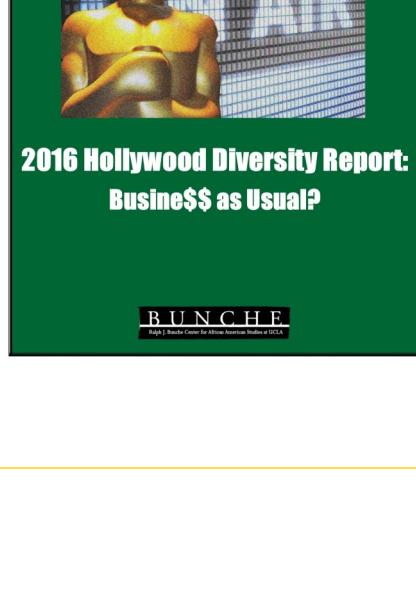

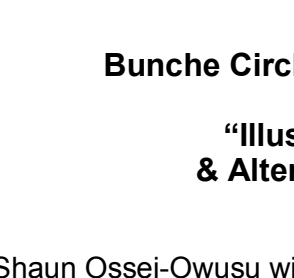
"The Futures of Black Radicalism"

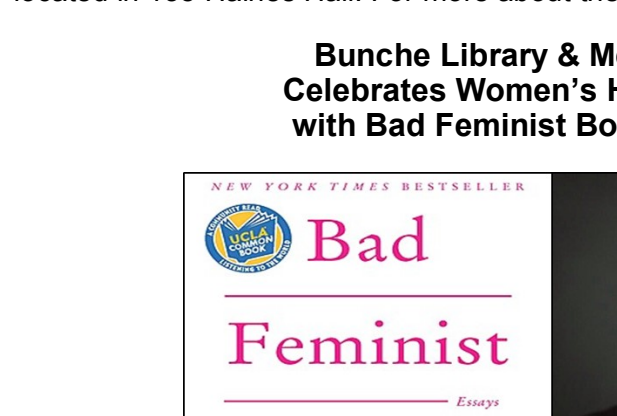
Also in February, Brown served as a music historian on TV One's "Unsung," telling the story of the great jazz and R&B virtuoso, Patrice Rushen.

Kelley is the Gary B. Nash Professor of American History at UCLA and a Bunche Center affiliated Faculty Member. To read the post, [Click Here.](#)

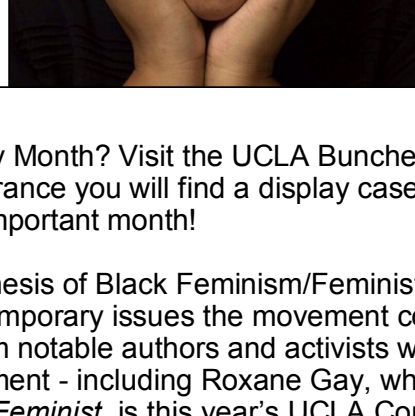
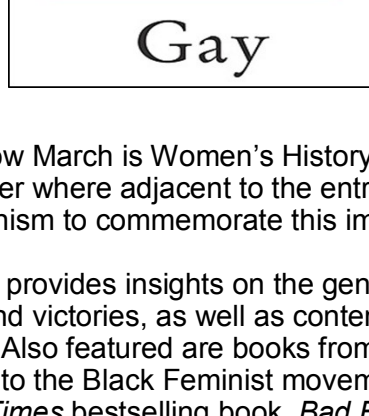


Library & Media Center News:

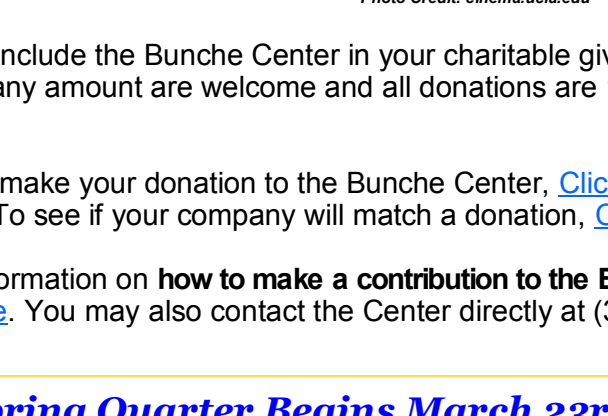
