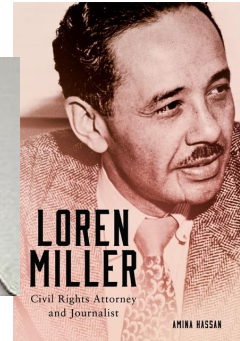

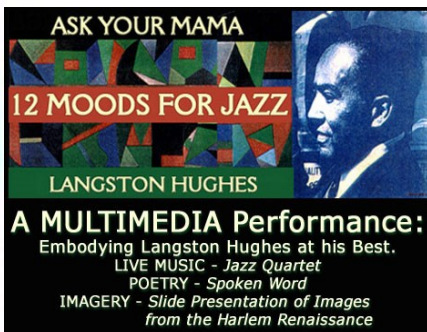

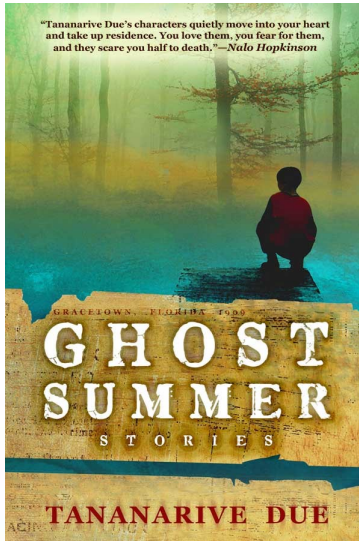

Award-winning author Tananarive Due will discuss her debut collection of short fiction, *Ghost Summer*. In the stories, Due takes us to Gracetown, a small Florida town that has both literal and figurative ghosts; into future scenarios that seem all too real; and provides empathetic portraits of those whose lives are touched by Otherness.

Due is former Cosby Chair in the Humanities at Spelman College, where she taught screenwriting, creative writing and journalism. She also teaches in the creative writing MFA program at Antioch University Los Angeles. The American Book Award winner and NAACP Image Award recipient is the author of twelve novels and a civil rights memoir. In 2010, she was inducted into the Medill School of Journalism's Hall of Achievement at Northwestern University.

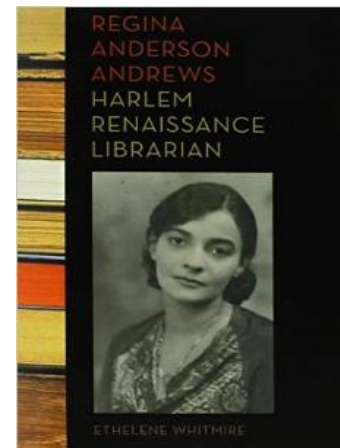
Ethelene Whitmire

Dr. Ethelene Whitmire will discuss her new biography, *Regina Andrews: Harlem Renaissance Librarian*. The book offers the first full-length study of Andrews's sustained efforts to break down racial barriers, activism, and pioneering work with the New York Public Library. Whitmire is an associate professor in the School of Library and Information Studies at the University of Wisconsin, Madison. She was a Professor in UCLA's Graduate School of Education & Information Studies from 2004-2006. Her areas of research include information seeking behavior of undergraduates and the library's impact on undergraduate critical thinking skills acquisition.
