


Images In Blackness Series Film Screening and Panel Discussion

The film is based on Jackie Robinson's autobiography, I Never Had It Made, which is the UCLA Common Book for the 2014-2015 academic year. The film screening will be followed by a panel discussion with industry professionals, former Dodgers, and academic scholars. The discussion with cover the adaptation of the book, what Robinson meant as a player, civil rights icon, and how he impacts us today.

Images in Blackness is an annual series which features filmmakers and scholars whose work explores the impact and the absence of diversity in the entertainment industry and in our everyday lives. The *Images* theme this year is Oral *History, Documentary, & Scripted Works Based on Real Life*. Previous participants include directors Justin Simien (*Dear White People*), Thomas Allen Harris (*Through A Lens Darkly*), and actress/director, Lisa Gay Hamilton (*Beah: A Black Woman Speaks*).
